



## General

**Nigeria** is a country in West Africa and the most populous country in Africa with a population of about 140 million distributed over more than 250 ethnic groups. Major religions practiced are Christianity, Islam and Traditional Religion. Nigeria shares land borders with the Republic of Benin in the west, Chad and Cameroon in the east, Niger in the north, and borders the Gulf of Guinea in the south. Abuja is the capital of Nigeria while Lagos is the commercial nerve center. The Niger River flows into the country through the North West and conflues the River Benue in the south. Nigeria is the 6<sup>th</sup> largest oil producer and is richly endowed with gas and other natural resources including substantial agricultural potential.

## Travel, Entry and Visa Requirements

All ECOWAS (Economic Community of West African States) passport holders do not require a visa to enter Nigeria. For passport holders of non-ECOWAS countries, please contact the nearest Nigerian High Commission or Embassy in advance of your trip for advice on how to procure entry visas to Nigeria.

All visitors also require a passport valid for at least six months beyond the end of the visit, and a return ticket or documents for onward travel. Those entering for business reasons must also have a letter of invitation, verification from Nigerian representatives abroad stating purpose of entry, and sufficient funds.

**Entry requirements for Americans:** United States citizens must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for UK nationals:** British citizens must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for Canadians:** Canadians must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for Australians:** Australians must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for South Africans:** South Africans must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for New Zealanders:** New Zealand citizens must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

**Entry requirements for Irish nationals:** Irish citizens must have a valid passport (must be valid for at least six months after period of intended stay). A visa is required.

### **Health**

All visitors to Nigeria require Yellow Fever vaccination. For participants from non-malaria infected areas, please contact your doctor for advice on the appropriate anti-malaria drugs.

## **Arrival in Nigeria**

### **Lagos**

All AfNOG participants are strongly encouraged to schedule arrival in Abuja. For those who must arrive at Lagos, you are advised to make connecting flight reservations with Virgin Nigeria (<http://www.virginnigeria.com/en/ng/timetables.aspx>) or Arik Airlines ([http://www.arikair.com/cy\\_citylink/flightscheduleView.asp](http://www.arikair.com/cy_citylink/flightscheduleView.asp)). These airlines have terminals at the International Wing of the Murtala Mohammed Airport; this will save you the hassle of having to go to the Domestic Wing of the Airport.

In the event that you have to shuttle to the Domestic Wing of the Murtala International Airport Lagos en-route to take a connecting flight to Abuja, you should engage only the services of registered airport taxi drivers. The cost of a taxi ride from the International Wing to the Domestic Wing is about N3, 000.00. You are also encouraged to use the Services of Aero Contractors (<http://www.acn.aero/cgi-bin/airkiosk/17/181002i?AJ=2&LANG=EN>) which also operates domestic flights from Lagos to Abuja.

### **Weather and Climate**

The climate in Nigeria varies from tropical in the coastal areas to sub-tropical in the north. There are two seasons, namely the Dry season (November – March) where rain does not fall except around the coastal areas and the Rainy Season (April - October) where rain fall is experienced.

The southern part of Nigeria experiences a maximum average temperature of 32°C with humidity level occasionally reaching 97%. As one travels north, you will experience a drier climate with temperatures ranging from 12°C to 36°C. The months of April and May record an average temperature of about 30 – 32°C as the rainy season begins. This is usually the warmest time in areas like the capital – Abuja.

#### **General Location**

Rockview Hotels are located in the Wuse II District of Abuja, 20 minutes away from the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport and 2 minutes away from the Transcorp Hilton Hotel. The Rockview hotels consist of two major buildings located on the same street namely; Rockview Hotel Classic (Main) and Rockview Hotel Royale (also known as the Extension). The distance between the two buildings is a 2 minute walk. The 2007 Africa Network Operators Group Event will take place at the Rockview Royale (Extension).

The Rockview Royale (Extension) has over 200 rooms with internet connectivity and 5 meeting rooms namely Zuma Hall, Ameachi Hall, Ushafa Hall, Training Room and Fountain Bar where Workshops and Meetings will take place. This wing of the hotel is large enough to accommodate all AfNOG, AfriNIC and other group participants during the event. Apart from the required workshop and meeting spaces for the AfNOG and AfriNIC event, there is ample room in the hotel compound for participants to relax when after functions. The Rockview Royale has a swimming pool, gym and tennis courts.

## **Transportation**

Although Abuja has buses and other unmarked cars that commute passengers within the city and to the satellite towns, AfNOG Participants are advised to use only the popular Abuja ‘Green Taxis’ (also known as El-Rufai’s Taxis). These taxis are always available at all hours in front of the Rock View Hotel. Private Car Hire Service can also be arranged by the Hotel Reception. Transport fare is charged based on the distance or the number of hours that the car is engaged. Typical rates range between N800 – N1, 200 depending on the number of hours spent.

## Currency

The Naira (NGN) is the official legal tender. 100 Kobo = 1 Naira (also written as N1.00). Visitors coming into Nigeria can change their currency at Bureau de Changes in the International Airports or Banks. Though international credit cards are not widely used, some Hotels and stores accept Visa, Master and Value Cards. There are several banks located about 1 – 5 minutes away from the venue (Rockview Hotel). Rockview Hotel accepts Visa and Master Cards. Exchange rates fluctuate without prior notice depending on various economic factors. The present exchange rates at the time of compiling this report were as follows:

## Government

The country is divided into 36 states including the Capital (Abuja) which is governed by a democratically elected President comprising the Federal Government. State Governors govern the States which are further subdivided into Local Government Areas. These are governed by the respective Local Government Authorities.

Abuja, the Federal Capital Territory is governed by the Minister of the Federal Capital who is responsible for managing and administering policies in the city.

## **Customs**

Though a few states in the Northern part of the country have adopted the Islamic legal system, this only applies to Muslims within that community. However, you are encouraged to respect the customs and beliefs of the people whenever you go there as a sign of respect as this is more likely to get you results very quickly as well as admiration and respect of the people you are dealing with.

## **Security**

Just like any other country, Nigeria has its share of what to look out for to avoid being a victim of crime. Visitors coming to Nigeria are urged to be sensible with their possessions, especially in Lagos. Nigerians are generally friendly and law-abiding people. There is a mix of foreigners from all over the world living in peace with the citizens.

With the advent of the present Democratic Administration in 1999, most parts of the country are experiencing the 'dividends of Democracy' with people becoming more aware and outspoken about their views.

Despite negative views especially about security in Nigeria, the atmosphere is in a process of continuous change with laudable socio-economic reforms. One problem that is being addressed are the Power outages or Blackouts which occurrence peaks during the beginning of the rainy season as low water levels are recorded at Kainji Dam, the major hydro-electric generating station. However, most hotels, offices and homes augment the epileptic power supply with generators, solar panels and batteries.

There are the odd cases of Kidnappings in the South, South Niger Delta Oil producing States which is generally limited to the Oil workers who are perceived by the local communities as bleeding them to death without adequate compensation.
